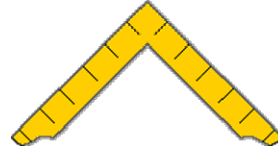

Square and Compasses



The Square and Compasses (or, more definitively,...a Square and a set of Compasses which are joined together...each leg of the compass pointing in opposite directions) is the single most universally identifiable symbol of Freemasonry.

Due to slight Masonic jurisdictional differences around the world, this symbol does not always look exactly the same to all Freemasons.

Some jurisdictions call this symbol the Square and Compass, (non-plural) and a few jurisdictions omit the "G" at its center.

But, no matter its slightly different look, all Freemasons are in unison as to what this symbol means to them within the fraternity.

THE MASONIC BIBLE

Before I became a Freemason I read from uninformed sources that there was a Masonic Bible and that it was satanic! Now that scared me and like Forrest Gump I ran like the wind blows! But now I have learned and may I say by first hand, that there is NO Masonic Bible. The Holy Bible that is used is the 1611 King James Version due to the fact that when Speculative Masons were allowed into the Mason Guild starting in England in 1717 the King James Version was the authorized version for the English speaking people. To this day it is still used in Lodges that are in predominant Christian communities.

The only difference you will see is that in the front there is a place where important degree dates are placed and biblical references relating to Masonic ceremonies. But after that is the entire King James Version of the Old and New Testaments with no deviation from the original 1611 version.

One more myth I would like to dispel is that Albert Pike's book called Morals and Dogma is NOT the "Masonic bible" as some have alleged. This is not our Volume of Sacred Law and never has been since the inception of Speculative Masons. A Sacred book in a Lodge could be the Holy Bible, also the Muslim Koran or the Hebrew Torah and in a Hindu community a Veda. The Volume of Sacred Law is a nonsectarian term for these books and nothing more.

May you search your rule and guide of faith on a daily basis and remember that Freemasonry is a philosophy and not a religion.

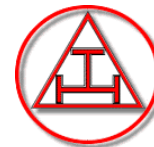
